## January Reset: Health and Wellbeing

In 2026, BA launched an innovative Health and Wellbeing campaign, tasking a different Director in each quarter to lead a company-wide wellbeing initiative.

In Q1, this began with our London and Southeast Operations Director, Lee Virgin, launching the Branch Step Competition. The goal of this was to compete as branches to determine who could clock the greatest number of steps, with individual competitions being fuelled between Management and Site Teams, and prizes being awarded to the winning branches and top individual performers.

With the assistance of the StepUp app, we established a live leaderboard, fuelling the competitive spirit amongst our colleagues. The motivation to win got so strong that we even had staff braving the January cold during their lunchbreaks to get their steps in.



## Samaritans: The Push-Up Challenge

BA set up ‘The Roofies’ team, committed towards taking on 2000 push-ups per person in remembrance of the 2000 lives lost to suicide across the world every single day. The Roofies included staff across the company, including some of our Directors, Designers, and Sustainability members, and managed to raise over £1000 for the Samaritans charity.

The challenge was not only a fantastic way of encouraging health and fitness among our colleagues, but it was also a conduit for increasing positive conversations about mental health and suicide, something so common, particularly among men in the construction industry.
